Reading Success:

Pease find attached a letter from the Rt Hon Nick Gibb MP that arrived in school earlier this week. You may remember that our Ofsted Inspection Report highlighted strengths in writing, specifically in KS2. We are now very pleased that our reading achievement has also been celebrated at government level placing us in the top 1% of primary schools in England for achievement in reading. Expectations at the end of KS1 and KS2 have risen significantly since the introduction of the new curriculum in 2014; making this achievement even more remarkable.

Funding for our EYFS Outdoor Area:

We are extremely pleased to inform our parents that we have very recently received notification that our application for Lottery funding has been approved securing $\pounds 10,000$ towards completely redeveloping and resourcing this area. With other successful grant applications from Levens Charity and Story Homes; and further funds from FOLS events, we will be soon developing plans to get our new area underway! Watch this space!

Preparing for General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR):

We are working very hard in school to ensure we are ready for the new regulations that come into force in May this year. The regulations involve us revising the ways in which we collect and store personal data; and review the security of all our data. This will have an impact on the day-to-day school business from the way in which we collect permission slips for school trips to how we store



electronic data regarding individual pupils. We will keep you updated as procedures change and would ask for your understanding and patience as we try to meet our legal obligation.

Online Agreements:

Nursery Consultation:

Following the successful introduction of nursery provision for children aged 3 years upwards, we are now consulting current and prospective parents about the possibility to extend our provision to include afternoon sessions. This will offer parents greater flexibility and give those entitled to 30hours free childcare additional provision on top of what we currently offer.
