PSHE	<p>This is a must for everyone. Please read through this important PowerPoint with an adult at home too if you can. You may need help with a few very long words that are, right now, rather important to us all. See the link to Anti Baddies in New Links on Skiddaw Class page. There are 6 Anti Baddies – choose 2 of them and draw them in your home learning book, name them and write one thing under each character that you think is important for you to do this week.</p>
English	<p>IDL Please remember to complete 2 IDL tasks every week day, record your stars in your home learning book in a table perhaps at the back of your book.</p> <p>Reading 15 - 30minutes per day, record this in your reading record.</p> <p>Make a card for a relative who you are not able to visit. The purpose of your card is to keep them cheerful, write inside to tell them your news and ask them how they are feeling. Please remember to post your card too.</p> <p>Spelling Look at the word list for Oaks and Willows. Oaks: improve, sure, sugar, eye, could Willows: opposite, ordinary, particular, peculiar, perhaps Practise your spellings by doing rainbow writing or pyramid writing. Look up each word in a dictionary and write a short phrase to explain what it means in your home learning book. Ask someone in your house to test you on your words or challenge someone to play a game of noughts and crosses with the words as we do in class.</p> <p>Story telling - David Walliams at 11am every day a different story appears!
