Details about this are here and linked at the top of the book page.</p> <p>Spelling Oaks – Following on from learning how to use apostrophes for possession last week, we are going to turn your list into an alliteration poem! Take the first one from your list eg Florence’s fairycake and add some other words to it. You will need a verb – something they are doing and perhaps some adjectives to describe it. Try to make as many of the words begin with the same sound. For example Florence’s fairycake might then become Florence’s fabulous fairycake fell on the floor! Try to make a poem with at least 6 lines all about different people and their things. You could illustrate your poem too. Willow – This week looking at punctuating direct speech. Do this BBC lesson. Watch the 2 videos and have a go at the activities in your home learning book.</p>

Use a normal pack of cards, remove the picture cards of Jacks, Queens and Kings. Decide if lower or higher is going to win for this game. Take the top 2 cards, add them together. You partner does the same. Check the adding for each pair. Whoever gets the highest or the lowest in this gets to keep the cards. Keep going until you have done 10 rounds. He was the very best violin player of his time, he was recognised as a super sword fighter and became the first classical composer of African ancestry. Joseph Bologne dismissed so many of the prejudices that people had about him and made his voice heard.
