Literacy/Communication and Language:

- Look at the pictures from the story to sequence them in the correct order. Can you describe what's happening in each picture? Can you retell the story? Write your own captions or create speech/thought bubbles – What is Baby Bear saying as he flies to the moon?
- Practise the language of **now, next and later** to describe what Baby Bear does in the story.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

- Why does Baby Bear need a bath when he gets back?
- Why is bath time a very important part of the day. Do you like bath time? What do you put in your bath?
- Design and make a healthy picnic for Baby Bear.
- What are the different ways to keep healthy? Think about both books – lots of sleep, exercise and healthy eating.

Mathematics:

- Keep practising and reciting the days of the week in order and learn to recognise the days of the week using the flash cards. You could also have a go at sequencing the months of the year too! In which month is your birthday? In which month does Santa come to visit? What month comes after April? Use your calendar or the flash cards to help.
