local families applying for Reception places. Mrs Haslam will be in charge of School when I am offsite for short periods or absent. She will also continue in her role as leader of SEND across our School.

Mrs Wadey is also a valued member of the Levens' leadership team. Her extensive skills and wide-ranging contributions over many years of service to our School community are hugely appreciated.

## **Healthy Snacks:**

Just a gentle reminder to all parents about what constitutes a healthy snack for our KS2 pupils. Children are permitted to bring in a snack to enjoy during morning break. This can be rice cakes, breadsticks, raisins or fruit. Please ensure snacks (and lunchboxes) are completely nut-free and that if your child likes to bring grapes, that these are cut in half to eliminate potential choking. Crisps, biscuits and cakes are not a suitable morning snack, so please don't send your child with these items next term.

Children in EYFS and Class 2 are provided with fruit every morning, so do not require snacks brought from home.

I anticipate that there will be news to share early in the autumn term. No building or demolition work will be undertaken during the summer holidays.

#### **Class 4 Residential:**

I had hoped to be able to write to parents with plans for our three day residential to Edinburgh in the spring term. However, we are still trying to secure alternative accommodation as our usual hostel is no longer taking school bookings. I will continue to try to secure arrangements over the summer holidays and hope to be in a position to write to you very early in the autumn term with our initial plans and approximate costings.

#### **School Day from September:**

Just a reminder that the school day officially starts at 8.45am and ends at 3.15pm for all pupils (except nursery pupils) from the beginning of the autumn term. Families are able to enter our site anytime from 8.30am where staff will continue to greet you each morning from 8.35am when our doors open. Arrival gates will be shut at 8.45am and learning begins as soon as your child arrives, so we encourage you to be as prompt as possible.

The school day for our nursery children ends at 3pm. Our Class 1 team will bring Nursery to the green gate to meet parents and carers for handover and open the gate for parents

arriving to collect older children at 3.15pm. The exception to this is any children attending YoYo After School Club that day.

We do already have some dates in the calendar for the start of the autumn term and our term dates for the next academic year are also published online. Please ensure you refer back to the website as it is continually updated with new information and events.

Please remember that School is closed on Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> September to enable families to attend The Westmorland County Show and all staff to attend essential training.
