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Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that you have all enjoyed a lovely, if not wet, festive period and that the new year has started well for you and your families.

The children have returned to school smiling, full of enthusiasm and ready to learn! What a fantastic start to the new term and a very special welcome to all our new families joining us in Nursery this week.

As you can see, the school building project is getting well underway with external ground works in the footprint of the new classroom being the immediate priority. It has been a



rather noisy week, but the digging up of the playground area is nearing completion and we are promised a more calm and quieter period to follow. The activity on the playground has certainly caused some interest and excitement for the children to observe as the work develops each day.

Class Information on the website:

Lunchtime Clubs:

Details will be shared with children during the school day and there is no need for any letters or reply slips to be returned from parents. Running club returns today (Friday 6th January) and gymnastics begins again on Monday for children in years 1+2.
