Strep A/Scarlet Fever Infection

Could I please encourage families to share and carefully read the information circulated earlier this week following confirmation of two cases in school. The number of confirmed and suspected cases has risen over the week and we are really keen that families are alert to the symptoms and take appropriate action in a timely way. Please can you also keep school updated with absence as soon as possible so that we can monitor the situation as we are required to do. We also need to know if any children develop flu or chicken pox over this next period.
