Dear Parents and Carers,

Bugs in School:

We are hoping that the sickness bug circulating school in the last few days is gradually starting to subside. However, in the meantime we will continue to be extremely vigilant in school ensuring regular handwashing, good ventilation and respiratory hygiene. We also have two new cases of StrepA in the last few days, so please look out for these symptoms too. It is important that your child/children do not attend if they have any signs of illness and pupils should not return until they are 48 hours clear of the last episode of D&V. Buildings Update:

We are really pleased with the progress of the new extension as we now have toilet cubicles, sinks, doors, windows and more! The plastering, painting and flooring is also nearing completion. Having said that, there is still much more to do before the space will be ready for use and all the internal work in the existing building will now not be undertaken until the summer holidays. On Friday, we welcomed back to school Building Control to inspect and quality assure the extension so far and I am pleased to report that the team continue to be completely satisfied with the standard of the work.

Despite delays, we are still confident that the project will be completed ready for the new term on Tuesday 5th September.

We will be hosting an opening event for all our families early in September; and then another event for our wider Levens community later in the term. I look forward to sharing further details with you soon.

As you know, Miss Robinson had found the pressures of being a full-time teacher very challenging and recently made the decision to reduce her hours to part-time. She will be greatly missed by everyone. We are currently in the final stages of recruiting a fulltime teacher for Class 2 starting in September. As soon as confirmed, I will update parents again.

I am also able to advise that Miss Butler has been visiting school this term and recently conducted some home visits for our new Nursery starters joining us in September. We are very pleased to be able to inform parents that Miss Butler intends to return to school at the start of November.
