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Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you have enjoyed a wonderful, healthy and happy half term break and are looking forward to events leading up to the Christmas holidays; it's such a special time to be involved in school life.



During the final few days of last half term, we enjoyed a focus week about what it means to be anti-racist. We were blown away by all your children's engagement in this topic. Regardless of their age or level of understanding, the pupils were enthusiastic to know and understand more in assemblies and lessons throughout the week. Every child in school watched and responded to the animation made by Cumbrian

children affected by racism in their communities. All of this culminated in a special assembly on Friday, when each class shared their learning on prominent figures in history or an inspirational person of current times. For example, Reception told us all about the inventor of the super soaker, Lonnie Johnson! Thankfully they didn't use their working model to drench us all in the hall! This themed week will be running again so that the children can keep learning and discussing different themes provoked by the film as they journey through school. The staff, and pupils, feel very strongly that the learning on this topic is an extremely important element of our curriculum.

During the same week, we enjoyed the first of two opening ceremonies. Visitors to school included Councillor Sue Sanderson, cabinet member for children's services, education and skills who was involved in approving funding for the



extension at the very early stages of our application to Cumbria County Council. Some of our children featured in so many of the photographs and film taken on the day; and three children were invited to be interviewed on camera.

Another opening ceremony takes place this Thursday from 6.30pm and is intended to give local residents an opportunity to look around the new environment.
