It is with great sadness that I let our parents and wider family members know that Pam Martin, a dear and well-respected friend to us all at Levens, passed away peacefully last week. Long before I became head at Levens in 2015, Pam had already contributed much to our school and this continued right up to the end of the autumn term, just last year.

She was one of the first people I met in my first few visits to Levens; and instantly I was struck by her warmness and kindness. Little did I know at that time, the enormous impact she would have on me in my new role as the headteacher of a Church of England School, but also on the families and all the pupils connected to school. There are so many ways that she has shown commitment, dedication and care for our school in projects that have raised our awareness; fundraised for charities on a global as well as local scale; and inspired us all. These have included: sharing her passion for God's creation and our environment; a commitment to raising the profile of social injustice and equality through initiatives like Fairtrade and Toilet Twinning; her expertise and support for developing staff knowledge in planning our religious education curriculum and our spiritual development. Furthermore, she has strengthened our links with our global partners in Uganda; led countless events for our youngest families and children through 'Messy Church' and Toddler Taster Days in school; and been a very long-standing and valuable volunteer who has accompanied us on so many visits and heard countless children read through the years. Her legacy at Levens will live on for many, many years. I am sure I speak for so many when I say how blessed we were to have her involved in our school and our community for so long. We will all miss her deeply.

School Meals

Apologies for having to advise a price increase in the cost of paid school meals from $1_{\rm st}$ April. The charge will increase from £3.35 to £3.45 per meal. This is a direct consequence of our school lunch supplier increasing the cost to school.

Snacks

Children in early years and KS1, are provided with a fruit snack every morning. Our KS2 pupils, those in Class 3 and 4, are permitted to bring in a healthy nutfree snack. This might be some raisins, rice cakes, some fruit or bread sticks. Please do not let your child bring in biscuits, cakes, sausage rolls, croissants etc for morning break.

Concerns from the community regarding activity on the playing fields

In the last few weeks, children have been witnessed playing dangerously and disrespectfully on the playing fields after school. Concerns have been raised with school by members of our parent body and wider community. The stone wall onto Levens Lane is deteriorating and large stones and accompanying debris is either falling onto or being thrown into the road where there are parked cars and vehicles travelling. This is no doubt causing a distraction and potentially causing damage to cars. Children have also been witnessed throwing stones and large branches on to the bowling green which is not an area for play for our pupils. We regularly convey our expectations to children, and we also urge parents and carers to reinforce these messages and have their children clearly in sight when they are playing after school on the playing fields so that the area is respected for everyone's enjoyment and a serious accident is avoided.
